MUSIC MINISTRY

Gustav Holst, 1874-1934, was one of the great composers of the 20 th century. Mainly, he wrote orchestral and choral music. Holst also composed several hymns, with his most famous being THAXTED, to which we sing the text, "O God Beyond All Praising." The tune originally appeared in his most famous orchestral work, "The Planets." Later, he adapted the melody into a hymn and named it after his village, Thaxted, in rural England. A generation ago, this hymn tune was barely known. Today, it is one of the most well-known and beloved hymns we sing. Interestingly, Holst visited Ann Arbor at least twice during the early 1930s.

DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

Wednesday and Thursday of this week are two feast days near and dear to the majority of the history of this parish, because the Church celebrates St. Monica on Wednesday and St. Augustine on Thursday. With our long, proud Augustinian history here, I wanted to make note of these feast days. And Sts. Monica and Augustine are both powerful intercessors for children who are away from the Church. Though it might take some time (maybe longer than we want), don't give up on praying through the intercession of these great saints for family members who

are lapsed in the practice of their faith!

Friday is also the memorial of the Passion of St. John the Baptist. This feast day reminds us to do the right thing, even if it means public embarrassment. If King Herod would have done what was right, he would not have martyred St. John the Baptist, even though he promised Salome in front of his guests. Doing the right thing may be hard at times, but it's always the right thing.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

St. Louis IX of France was a king known not only for his political leadership but also for his deep personal holiness. Crowned at a young age, he ruled with justice, humility, and a concern for the poor, often feeding beggars at his own table and establishing hospitals, including one for those suffering from leprosy.



He was a devout son of the Church, he prayed the Divine Office daily, promoted peace among Christian rulers, and sought to govern as a true servant of Christ. Though he participated in the Crusades, which marked his reign, what stands out most is his integrity and virtue, earning him the reputation of a saintly ruler who united faith and kingship. Canonized in 1297, St. Louis remains a model of Christian leadership, charity, and fidelity to God.
