## **SAINT OF THE WEEK**

St. Stanislaus of Cracow was a bishop and martyr, revered as Poland's patron saint. Known for his piety and moral courage, he openly opposed King Bolesław II's tyranny, condemning his injustices and defending the rights of the Church and the oppressed. This defiance led to his assassination allegedly by the king himself while Stanislaus was celebrating Mass. His brutal death caused outrage, forcing Bolesław into exile. Canonized in 1253 by Pope Innocent IV, Stanislaus remains a powerful symbol of justice, faith, and resistance against oppression.

# DON ANTONIO'S DISPATCH

Today begins Passiontide, the time within Lent where we really start focusing on the Passion of our Lord. If you've been half-hearted about your Lenten practices, now is certainly the time to strengthen your efforts to prepare your hearts for the transforming Resurrection of Christ. In order to further take away the delight of our eyes, we cover up statues around the church.

A while back, I had mentioned relics, and a parishioner asked me which relics we use at the high altar for the Extraordinary Form Mass. Here's a list of the relics that we have, in case you want to ask for their intercession any time

you come to St. Matthew:

St. Peter Eymard St. Thérèse of Lisieux

St. Pius X True Cross\*
St. Gerard\* St. Raphaela Mary
St. Matthew St. Augustine
St. Monica St. Anthony of Padua

The \* signifies that we don't have any documentation that we have found to support that it is truly that relic. The rest are all first class relics. I try to bring them out on their feast days so that people can venerate the relics. All holy men and women, saints of God, pray for us!

Next week on Palm Sunday, Fr. Brian Lenz will be helping me hear confessions after the 1 p.m. Mass (I also have a baptism after the 1 p.m. Mass). If you're trying to go before Easter, this would be a perfect time, since I'll have

extra help!

Our penultimate deadly sin is greed. St. Thomas Aquinas describes greed (or covetousness) in the Summa Theologiae (IIa-IIae.cxviii.1) as either an excess in acquisition and

retention of things or as an excessive affection for riches which is not in accord with what he needs for living. In terms of holding on to things or acquiring too many things, that is a sin against one's neighbor, who has a right to those things that we do not need. When it comes to a love of money or possessions, that is a sin against ourself, as we are not rightly ordering our own desires.

The best way to fight this sin is to be generous.

Whenever I buy or receive new clothes, I

tend to donate some of my older clothes (still in good shape) to the poor. Or, if we have many things, we can share them with others. I definitely have more bourbon than I need for myself, but I do try to share it with others, especially the good stuff, so that I am not controlled by my desire for good bourbon.

When it comes to our money, we should make sure that we take care of our financial responsibilities for our families. Beyond that, we should make allowances for supporting the Church, starting with our parish, then the diocese, then the universal Church, and the poor (in the same order as the local charities, regional charities, and national or international charities). In this way we make sure that money doesn't become a false god to us.

# **EXPLORING THE CATHOLIC FAITH**

#### CATECHESIS OF THE GOOD SHEPHERD

We know that silence is necessary to prepare ourselves to encounter God. It is in silence that the religious or spiritual sense of the child may be developed. Silence leads the child to a relationship with him or herself, through the listening of his or her own breathing. As children become conscious of their inner silence, they realize that this allows them to be able to listen to and answer God. Silence is a great help for the child's prayer life. At home, you may want to practice quiet time at the prayer table. Silence is necessary for prayer.

 At home, invite your child to sit comfortably at the prayer table, with his or her body still, and eyes closed. Depending upon the age of the child, allow for a few minutes (or more) of silence. Discuss what was heard.
